Conditions of Sale

The CMS welcomes items of cricket memorabilia for its auctions. There will normally be just two auctions in the year - March and October.

The CMS reserves the right to refuse items which are damaged etc., or we have doubts about authenticity.

Reserves can be placed on lots but must be agreed with the CMS. They should reflect realistic values/expectations and not be the "highest price" expected.

The CMS will take 7% of the price realised, the vendor 93% which will normally be paid 6 weeks after the auction.

The CMS will undertake to advertise the memorabilia to all its members (including overseas) and only CMS members are eligible to bid for items.

Members are welcome to send postal bids which should be in writing/e-mail before the auction. Bids will normally start at 60% of the lower estimate unless there is a higher reserve price or other postal bids. Any bids submitted with pence, ie. £5.20 or £5.80, will automatically be rounded up.

Items will be sent to successful postal bidders after the auction and will usually be sent by recorded delivery. Postage will be paid by the successful postal bidder. However, framed and glazed items must be collected at an auction or arrangements made for collection unless the buyer is content for items to be sent without insurance cover, as the CMS is unable to obtain insurance for such items.

The CMS will be responsible for the items sent for auction while they are in the possession of the CMS.

The CMS welcomes items of particular and unusual interest for the auctions. Non-members can send items for auction but we would discourage large quantities of books, magazines etc.

A list of prices realised at an auction will be displayed on the Society's website after the auction.

Remember - it is the only cricket auction with no buyers premium!

1. Signed Miniature Bat. Stuart Surridge “Roy McLean” bat signed by Australian Tourists to South Africa 1957/58. The signatories are Craig, Benaud, Burge, Burke, Davidson, Drennan, Favell, Gaunt, Harvey, Jarman, Kline, Grout, Mackay, McDonald, Meckiff and Simpson. The back of the bat has been signed by twelve South African players from the series: van Ryneveld, McGlew, Endean, Waite, Funston, Goddard, Tayfield, Heine, McLean, Adcock, Burger and Carlstein. The bat is in very good condition apart from the handle grip which has suffered from melting. The signatures are remarkably clear bearing in mind the age of the item. An unusual lot to find in this country. Est. £12/18

2. Signed Bat. A Slazenger V500 bat signed by both sides from the England Tour to South Africa 1995/6. The South African signatories are Cronje, Matthews, Kirsten, Richardson, Cullinan, Donald, Pollock, Kallis, Hudson, McMillan and Woolmer. The England signatories are Atherton, Stewart, Smith, Fraser, Ilett, Malcolm, Hick, Thorpe, Ramprakash, Gough, Russell, Illingworth, Martin, Crawley and Cork. The bat is in very good condition but the grip on the handle has perished and needs renewing. Est. £8/12

3. Teapot by Swineside Ceramics “The Teapottery” in the form of a pavilion with three players on the front. The clock acts as the lid. Overall size, length 22cms including spout and handle, height 19cms including lid and width 13cms. In very good, boxed condition. Est. £15/20

4. Brian Lara. A statuette of Lara playing his signature pull shot. The figure stands on a detachable wooden base and is 23cms in overall height. It is from the “Art of Sport” series made from cold cast porcelain by Paul Szeiler for Endurance Ltd as a limited edition in 1994. The label on the base reads “BRIAN LARA, West Indies, 375 v ENGLAND 18-4-94”. The statuette is in very good condition with no easily seen faults but the bat is a replacement, the original having been lost. Est. £35/50

5. Harold Bird. A statuette of Bird wearing an umpire’s white coat. The figure stands on a detachable wooden base and is 23cms in overall height. It is from the “Art of Sport” series made from cold cast porcelain by Paul Szeiler for Endurance Ltd as a limited edition. The label on the base reads “DICKIE”. Very good condition with no easily seen faults. Est. £30/40

6. W.G. Grace. A statuette of Grace wearing a red and yellow hooped cap in characteristic batting pose. The figure stands on a detachable wooden base and is 23cms in overall height. It is from the “Art of Sport” series made from cold cast porcelain by Paul Szeiler for Endurance Ltd as a limited edition in 1995. The label on the base reads “Dr W.G. GRACE, 1848-1915”. The figure of Grace is in very good condition with no easily seen faults but the bat is a replacement, the original having been lost. Est. £20/30

7. Harold Larwood. A statuette of Larwood posed at the start of his run. The figure stands on a detachable wooden base and is 22cms in overall height. It is from the “Art of Sport” series made from cold cast porcelain for Endurance Ltd in 1995. The label on the base reads “HAROLD LARWOOD, ENGLAND, 1926-1932”. The statuette is in very good condition with no easily seen faults. Est. £30/40

8. Denis Compton. A statuette of Compton playing his signature sweep shot. The figure stands on a detachable wooden base and is 16cms in overall height. It is from the “Art of Sport” series made from cold cast porcelain by Paul Szeiler for Endurance Ltd as a limited edition in 1994. The label on the base reads “DENIS COMPTON, ENGLAND 1938-1956”. The statuette is in very good condition with no easily seen faults. Est. £35/50

9. William Ewart Astill. Framed and glazed copy of the contract between Astill and Leicestershire County Cricket Club dated November 1904 to cover 1905. The document is **signed** by Astill and the Assistant Secretary of Leicestershire. The text is faded and difficult to read but the vendor has provided a typed transcription. **Sold with** a small, signed photograph of Astill in a bowling pose wearing white flannels and what appears to be an army tunic on a field being watched by reclining soldiers. A special piece of Leicestershire history. Est. £30/40

10. Glass Tankard produced to celebrate Leicestershire's winning of the County Championship 1975. The tankard has the Leicestershire Fox and copy signatures of the squad transferred on to the body. In very good condition. **Sold with** two Wedgwood bone china mugs from an Outdoor Pursuits Series "Cricket" with a scene from a match displayed. Both are in very good condition. Est. £6/12

11. Cricket Characters 2 by John Ireland. Fully **signed** to their Picture. A very good copy of the second volume of the cricket caricatures of John Ireland. Every player portrayed has signed directly to his picture including Jonathan Agnew who has provided the text, thus no laid down signatures. Est. £80/100

12. 19-90 Jim Laker by Brian Scovell. An excellent copy of the book **signed** by the Author and seven of the survivors from the famous match, Trevor Bailey, Alan Oakman and Peter Richardson of England together with Colin McDonald, Ian Craig, Neil Harvey and Richie Benaud of Australia. The book is about far more than the Old Trafford match. Est. £25/30

13. The Ashes Crown the Year by Jack Fingleton. A good copy of the book about the 1953 season with a rather ragged, now protected, dust jacket **signed** by Roy Tattersall, Reg Simpson, Alec Bedser, Tom Graveney and Trevor Bailey of England together with Alan Davidson, Arthur Morris and Neil Harvey of Australia. 14. Remembering Hookes. A book produced in association with the "David Hookes Foundation" with a view to increasing the number of organ donations. Contributions from a host of cricket writers and players. The book is in excellent condition and has a brief Christmas gift dedication. A scarce item in this country. Est. £10/15

15. Four interesting prints. (1) W.G. Grace. A small (215 x 175mm) framed and glazed oval picture of Grace in a batting pose. Very well framed and in overall excellent condition. **(2&3)** Two very good framed and glazed coloured prints of early cricket matches. One 36 x 29cms, the other 38 x 27cms. **(4) Tossing for Innings.** A very good framed and glazed copy of the painting by Robert James which hangs in the pavilion at Lord's. The overall size is 305 x 355mm. Est. £8/12

16. The History of the Cricket Bat. An illustration of the development of the cricket bat from 1720 to modern times (?). One seventh replicas of bats taken from the Lord's Museum. Very well presented with a description on the back and in excellent condition. Est. £8/12

17. Lawson Wood Picture. A framed and glazed Lawson Wood print of a large policeman walking off with bat, ball and stumps from a lads game in the park. He looks satisfied, an emotion not shared by those deprived of their equipment. The overall size is 30 x 37 cms and although there is a slight sign of damp at the bottom of the mount the picture is in very good condition. Est. £4/6

18. Sparrow on the Cricket Ball. Limited Edition (11/750) of a fine china model produced by "Mistan Porcelain" Maple Studios, Worcester, commemorating the event of a hedge sparrow being struck and killed by a ball bowled by Jahangir Khan of Cambridge University at Lord's in July 1936. The model is in very good condition, on a wooden plinth and is accompanied by a

small card giving details of the event. The original is preserved in the museum at Lord's.

The plate faithfully follows the design of one produced in 1895 by Coalport. (Currently on sale for £1,000) The only variations are to the bats, bails and stumps which have been redrawn to conform with the design of present day equipment. The plate is boxed, in excellent condition and is complete with Limitation Certificate.
