## Conditions of Sale

The CMS welcomes items of cricket memorabilia for its auctions. There will normally be just two room auctions in the year - March and October, with a postal auction in July.

The CMS reserves the right to refuse items which are damaged etc., or we have doubts about authenticity.

Reserves can be placed on lots but must be agreed with the CMS. They should reflect realistic values/expectations and not be the "highest price" expected.

The CMS will take 7% of the price realised, the vendor 93% which will normally be paid 6 weeks after the auction.

The CMS will undertake to advertise the memorabilia to all its members (including overseas) and only CMS members are eligible to bid for items.

Members are welcome to send postal bids which should be in writing/e-mail before the auction. Bids will normally start at 60% of the lower estimate unless there is a higher reserve price or other postal bids. Any bids submitted with pence, ie. £5.20 or £5.80, will automatically be rounded up.

Items will be sent to successful postal bidders after the auction and will usually be sent by recorded delivery. Postage will be paid by the successful postal bidder. However, framed and glazed items must be collected at an auction or arrangements made for collection unless the buyer is content for items to be sent without insurance cover, as the CMS is unable to obtain insurance for such items.

The CMS will be responsible for the items sent for auction while they are in the possession of the CMS.

The CMS welcomes items of particular and unusual interest for the auctions. Non-members can send items for auction but we would discourage large quantities of books, magazines etc.

A list of prices realised at an auction will be displayed on the Society's website after the auction.

Full details can be found in Wikipedia and it’s a military service well worth reading.*

*David Hughes, who is 89, was a wicketkeeper who played only one first class match for Somerset in 1955 against Nottinghamshire when Harold Stephenson was unavailable. He took one catch and a stumping and made his only 2 runs in the second innings. He played for the Second XI and Wiltshire, his last match being in 1977.*

**235. Norman Stewart “Mandy” Mitchell-Innes autograph** on an A4 sheet with the county banner to the top, player’s name in bold and a box below containing his signature. The original written request for his autograph is enclosed, that, too, having his signature. Excellent Est. £6/8

*Mitchell-Innes played for Somerset between 1931 and 1949, also playing for Oxford University and one Test match against South Africa in 1935. Between 2001 and his death in 2006 he was the oldest surviving English Test cricketer.*

*Known as ‘Alan’, Shirreff’s cricket career started in 1939 with Cambridge University and after spells with Hampshire and Kent played two matches for Somerset in 1958. He was in the RAF during the war, flying American P-51 Mustangs. After the war he continued to serve in the RAF, rising to Squadron Leader.*

**237. Michael Vyvyan Spurway autograph** on an A4 sheet with the county banner to the top, player's name in bold and a box below containing his signature. Excellent Est. £6/8

*Michael Spurway who died in 2007 at the age of 98 played 3 matches as a wicketkeeper/batsman for Somerset in 1929. He, too, had an interesting services history. At the time of his death he was the only cricketer who had played county cricket in the 1920s.*

**241. Donald Francis Xavier Munden autograph** on an A4 sheet with the county banner to the top, player's name in bold and a box below containing his signature. Excellent Est. £6/8

*Don Munden played only 7 matches for the county in 1961-62, his debut being at the Hinckley ground. His brothers, Paul and Victor also played for Leicestershire.*
