#### Conditions of Sale

The CMS welcomes items of cricket memorabilia for its auctions. There will normally be just two room auctions in the year - March and October, with a postal auction in July.

The CMS reserves the right to refuse items which are damaged etc., or we have doubts about authenticity.

Reserves can be placed on lots but must be agreed with the CMS. They should reflect realistic values/expectations and not be the "highest price" expected.

The CMS will take 7% of the price realised, the vendor 93% which will normally be paid 6 weeks after the auction.

The CMS will undertake to advertise the memorabilia to all its members (including overseas) and only CMS members are eligible to bid for items.

Members are welcome to send postal bids which should be <u>in writing/e-mail</u> before the auction. Bids will normally start at 60% of the lower estimate unless there is a higher reserve price or other postal bids. Any bids submitted with pence, ie. £5.20 or £5.80, will automatically be rounded up.

Items will be sent to successful postal bidders after the auction and will usually be sent by recorded delivery. Postage will be paid by the successful postal bidder. However, framed and glazed items must be collected at an auction or arrangements made for collection unless the buyer is content for items to be sent without insurance cover, as the CMS is unable to obtain insurance for such items.

The CMS will be responsible for the items sent for auction while they are in the possession of the CMS.

The CMS welcomes items of particular and unusual interest for the auctions. Non-members can send items for auction but we would discourage large quantities of books, magazines etc.

A list of prices realised at an auction will be displayed on the Society's website after the auction.

**Llewellyn** was the first non-white player for South Africa.

**16.** Letter dated 1964 from E A English (Ted) to John Arlott. A two-sided handwritten letter signed 'E A English (Ted)' in which he thanks Arlott for a copy of *The Cricketer*. He goes on to write about a match between Alton and an Aldershot Army School Masters XI in which the latter were dismissed for 2. He continues with other cricketing reminiscences. It's absolutely fascinating and the handwriting of this man, who was 100 at the time, would put many of us to shame. At the time of his death in 1966 he was thought to be the oldest first-class cricketer. He played 18 1st class matches for Hampshire. This is a unique item in very good condition.

Charles Anthony Fry followed in the footsteps of both his father and grandfather, C B Fry, in playing for Hampshire. As of 2024, this remains the only instance of three generations of one family playing for the county.

**Ted Drake** is better known as a footballer, first with Southampton and then Arsenal with whom he won two league titles and the FA Cup. He also played 5 times for England. His managerial career was mostly with Chelsea from 1952-61 where he led the team to a league title, becoming the first manager to win the league as both player and manager.

**19. Alfred John Evans autograph** on an A4 sheet with the county banner to the top, player's name in bold and a box below containing his laid down signature. Excellent Est. £6/10

**John Evans** played in ninety 1<sup>st</sup> class matches, some of which were for Hampshire between 1908 and 1920. He played one Test match, the 2<sup>nd</sup> match v Australia in 1921. During the First World War he served with the Royal Flying Corps and was twice made a prisoner of war. He made persistent escape attempts, two of which were successful, and during the Second War served in MI9.

**20. Geoffrey George Lockwood Hebden autograph** on an A4 sheet with the county banner to the top, player's name in bold and a box below containing his signature. Included is a brief note, also signed. Excellent

**Geoffrey Hebden** played six 1<sup>st</sup> class matches for Hampshire between 1937 and 1951. He served in the British Army during the Second World War, being commissioned as a second lieutenant into the Dorset Regiment in1940.

**21. Basil George von Brandis Melle autograph** on an A4 sheet with the county banner to the top, player's name in bold and a box below containing his laid down signature. Excellent

**Basil Melle** made three 1<sup>st</sup> class appearances in 1914 for Hampshire and a further 24 between 1919 and 1921. He played 1<sup>st</sup> class cricket in his native South Africa both before and after the First World War. David Frith saw Melle as playing a role in the origins of bodyline bowling through his 'inswingers with three short-legs'. However, during his time with Hampshire his bowling had declined to such an extent that it was seldom used in matches.

**22. Richard Henry Moore autograph** on an A4 sheet with the county banner to the top, player's name in bold and a box below containing his signature. Excellent Est. £10/15

**Dick Moore** played for Hampshire between 1931 and 1939. Included with his autograph is a press cutting of his obituary which includes reference to his scoring 316 runs in a day, only to be given out LBW off the final ball of the day. However, on the same day Eddie Paynter was also scoring a triple century and at the time of Dick Moore's death it remained the only occasion that this had happened. His 316 remains the highest 1<sup>st</sup> class score for Hampshire.

**23. Robert Montagu Poore autograph** on an A4 sheet with the county banner to the top, player's name in bold and a box below containing his laid down signature. This is an exceptionally rare signature. Excellent

**Robert Poore,** whilst serving with the British Army in South Africa, played three Test matches for South Africa in 1896. He played for Hampshire between 1898 and 1906 with 1899 being his outstanding season when he was one of Wisden's Five Cricketers of the Year. He was never able to repeat that success in subsequent seasons, mainly because of various injuries. He served in the Boer War and subsequently in India, where he continued to play 1<sup>st</sup> class cricket into his midfifties.

54); P C L Holloway (1994-2003); M J Kitchen (1960-79); M Olive (1977-81) (with signed note); N F M Popplewell (1979-85); L D Sutton (1997-98) (3 matches) and B J Trott (1997-98) (also 3 matches). \* laid down. Each sheet in excellent condition.

For those unfamiliar with **Gimblett's** trials with Somerset and his 1<sup>st</sup> class debut it is recommended that you read the Wikipedia piece if not David Foot's book.

**Dennis Silk** is another of those cricketers whose posts, having retired from playing, hold him in high regard. He was a personal friend of the cricket-loving poet, Siegfried Sassoon. **Alan Whitehead** is, perhaps, better known as an umpire whose career in that capacity spanned from 1970 – 2005, including five Test matches.

**26. Donald Charles Cleverley and Gordon Lindsay Weir (New Zealand).** Autographs of each on an A4 sheet with the country banner to the top, player's name in bold and a box below containing the signature. Included is a handwritten letter from Don Cleverley in which he says (in 2002) that he is the second oldest international cricketer still alive (he was 92). He goes on to say that Lindsay Weir is the oldest at 93. Each sheet in excellent condition.

Don Cleverley played in two Test matches for New Zealand 14 years apart. He played in the inaugural Test match against South Africa at Christchurch in 1932 and in the notorious one-off Test match against Australia at Wellington in 1946. New Zealand were completely outplayed to such an extent that the two sides did not play a further Test match until 1973. Lindsay Weir was not selected for New Zealand's first ever Test match against England in 1930 but played in the other three matches and toured England with the 1931 team. In all he played 11 Test matches. He became the oldest Test cricketer in 2001, following the death of Alf Gover. He died in 2003, aged 95 and Don Cleverley died in 2004, aged 94. These are very rare signatures from the earliest days of New Zealand Test cricket.

**27. Twelve Leicestershire autographs** each on an A4 sheet with the county banner to the top, player's name in bold and a box below containing the signatures. The signatories are: J Birkenshaw (1961-80); N G B Cook (1978-85); B Cromack (1959-68): C D Crowe (1995-2009); F G Foulds (1952-56); M J Hoggard (2010-13); A Kumble (2000); C C Lewis (1987-2000); J K Maunders (2003-07); M Rosenberg (2006-07); M J K Smith (1951-55) and R W Tolchard (1965-83). Each sheet in excellent condition.

Bernard Cromack played 33 times between 1959 and 1961 and made 1 further appearance in 1968 in a rain affected match in which he neither batted nor bowled. Carl Crowe played only 42 matches over a 14 year period, playing mainly for Berkshire when not required by Leicestershire, which was clearly not very often. Fred Foulds played once in both 1952 and 1956 during which he scored three ducks and 1, finishing his career with a batting average of 0.25. Leicester born M J K Smith played for the county during his time at Oxford University.

**Scott Boswell** is perhaps remembered for bowling a 14 ball over in the 2001 C&G Trophy final at Lord's, which Cricinfo rated the 6<sup>th</sup> worst over in the game's history.

**29. South Africa 1924 autograph book sheet** signed by H W Taylor; J M M Commaille; R H Catterall; M J Susskind; G A L Hearne; S J Pegler; T A Ward and D J Meintjes. HOWEVER, **Worcestershire** aficionados may prefer the reverse side which is signed by George Abell; Arthur Robinson; William Hampton; Harry Rogers; George Wilson and George Harris. VG

**Arthur Robinson** played for Hull Kingston Rovers in the Charity Challenge Final of 1905, losing 6-0 to Warrington.

- **30. Surrey autograph book page c1920.** The signatories (all in ink) first side are: J W Hitch; F C Eldridge (see below); H S Harrison; A M Ducat (see below); T E Abel; H Strudwick; and A Sandham. On the reverse: H A Peach; J B Hobbs; T S Jennings; T F Shepherd and P G H Fender. Included is a letter from Surrey CCC concerning F C Eldridge and a photocopy from the CMS magazine of June 2009 regarding the signature of Ducat. VG

- F C Eldridge was on the Surrey ground staff and played for the Young Players of Surrey and Surrey Club and Ground in 1920 and 1921. Andy Ducat played for Surrey between 1906 and 1931 and also played in one Test match. He had no middle name, thus the mystery of the A M Ducat signature. In the CMS magazine Keith Hayhurst says that Ducat was known in the Surrey dressing room as 'Mac', so as not to be confused with Andy Sandham who was referred to as 'Andy'. Keith went on to say that on rare occasions Ducat signed 'A M Ducat' and that the current vendor should 'keep it safe'. The magazine article illustrated the sheets as above. Thus, the signature may not be unique, but certainly rare.

**Don Topley** coached Zimbabwe between 1990 and 1992 during which time Zimbabwe beat England in a group match in the 1992 World Cup. England were captained by Gooch who was Topley's Essex captain. Reasonably interesting?

Harry Kelleher had a sensational debut, taking 10-73 against Worcestershire. After one season he joined Northamptonshire and at the time of writing is the oldest living former Northamptonshire player (95). Ron Tindall negotiated a special arrangement with Surrey allowing him to miss the first and last months of the cricket season so that he could play football for Chelsea.

**35. John Berry Hobbs** (1905-34). Laid down signature on an A4 sheet with the county banner to the top, player's name in bold and a box below containing the signature. Excellent

- **36. Michael David Willett, Surrey 1955-67.** Laid down signature 'Yours faithfully Michael Willett' on an A4 sheet with the county banner to the top, player's name in bold and a box below containing the signature. Included is a letter from his widow saying that Michael died I January 2002 (the autograph request being in late 2003) and that she remains in touch with several Surrey players. She explains that the signature is from a letter which was written but never sent. Also enclosed are: a small b&w photograph by A Wilkes of West Bromwich; a later colour photograph marked on the reverse 'M D Willett Capt Croham Hurst Golf Club 1963'; and a larger b&w press photograph of Michael Willett scoring a four off Tom Cartwright in the match v Warwickshire in May 1961. A poignant and unique collection of memorabilia. All items excellent
- **37. NatWest Finals.** A set of brochures for the Finals from 1981-1999 (19 in total). Those for 1983 and 1991 include the scorecards, whilst the latter is **multi-signed** by both teams missing Aqib Javed and Shaun Udal of Hampshire and Waqar Younis, Mark Feltham, James Boiling, Alec Stewart and Chris Bullen of Surrey. - **38. B&H Finals.** A set of brochures for all the Finals 1972 2002 (31 in total). The keen-eyed among you will spot Lot 95 in which the intimation is that 1998 was the last B&H Final. Not so! In 1999 it was the B&H Super Cup and the brochure included the first Test match and the World Cup Final. Those for 2000 2002 were 'ordinary' with the 2002 edition marked 'The Final Final'. That for 1994 includes a match ticket, as does the 1988 one; scorecards are included for 1987, 1988, 1989, 1992, 1995, 2001 and 2002. Some are **signed.** 1988 is fully signed by the winning Hampshire team; 1992 by the Hampshire team; and1997 by most of the Surrey team. As if that is not enough, the 2001 brochure includes the FDC. (Please be aware that the signatures have not been checked but the vendor is a meticulous recorder of details.) Virtually as new
