

Conditions of Postal Sale

The CMS reserves the right to refuse items which are damaged or unsuitable, or we have doubts about authenticity.

Reserves can be placed on lots but must be agreed with the CMS. They should reflect realistic values/expectations and not be the "highest price" expected.

The CMS will take 7% of the price realised, the vendor 93% which will normally be paid no later than 6 weeks after the auction.

The CMS will undertake to advertise the memorabilia for auction on its website no later than 3 weeks prior to the closing date of the auction. Bids will only be accepted from CMS members.

Postal bids must be <u>in writing or e-mail</u> by the closing date and time shown above. Generally, no item will be sold below 10% of the lower estimate without reference to the vendor. Thus, an item with a \pounds 10-15 estimate can be sold for \pounds 9, but not \pounds 8, without approval.

The incremental scale for the acceptance of bids is as follows: £2 increments up to £20, then $\pounds 20/22/25/28/30$ up to £50, then £5 increments to £100 and £10 increments above that. So, if there are two postal bids at £25 and £30, the item will go to the higher bidder at £28. Should there be two identical bids, the first received will win. Bids submitted between increments will be accepted, thus a £52 bid will not be rounded either up or down. Any bids submitted with pence, ie. £5.20 or £5.80, will be rounded up.

Items will be sent to successful postal bidders within 3 weeks of the auction and will be sent by the cheapest rate commensurate with the value and size of the item. Postage and packaging will be paid by the successful postal bidder. Successful bidders should aim to pay quickly, so that accounts with vendors can be settled.

The CMS will be responsible for the items sent for auction while they are in the possession of the CMS.

A list of prices realised at an auction will be published on the Society's website.

Remember - it is the only cricket auction with no buyer's premium – and postage is charged at cost!

EPHEMERA

1. Lancashire v Northamptonshire, Lytham, 1991. A match programme with details of the expected players of both sides. As new Est. £2/3

2. The De Vere England Legends Challenge. Programme for a match at Grappenhall CC, undated but seems to be from 2012. A strong Legends line-up with a Lancashire bias, only to be expected given the location. Good details of all the Legends. As new. **Sold with** a programme for England XI v Monton CC 2018, J W Lees PCA Cricket Challenge. As new Est. £2/3

3. Chorley CC Centenary 1910-2010. Souvenir brochure with interesting article by former players, well known in other sporting fields. As new. **Sold with** a programme for Chorley's third successive Abbot Ale National Club Championship Final in 1996. VG Est. £2/3

4. London, Chatham and Dover Railway handbill advertising a match between the Australians and the Players on 27th Septembers 1880 at the Crystal Palace. Not an original but one issued in a limited edition of 25, this being no. 20. The **signed** text below says "Twenty-five copies produced for private circulation January 1999" signed by Irving Rosenwater with the limitation number below. The item is laminated and is presumed to be one of the original 25 copies. As new Est. £40/60

5. South African Tour 1947. A stiff card with head and shoulder images of the tourists round the outside and an autograph box in the middle with facsimile signatures. To the reverse is a list of the team's fixtures. Signs of old glue to the reverse from when it has been affixed in an album and a horizontal fold. Good+ $Est. \pounds 2/5$

6. Cricket: The Cornhill Years. A 12pp brochure produced to mark 2000 as the last year of Cornhill Insurance's sponsorship of England Test cricket, an association which began in 1997, albeit that the first Test sponsored was in 1978. Well illustrated brochure with some text. As new Est. £3/5

7. West Indies Touring Team v Sir Learie Constantine's XI, 1963. A souvenir brochure and scorecard for the match held at the Oval on 14th September 1963. Attractive brochure with a centrefold of the Touring Team; the scorecard has the West Indies innings completed by hand and the first two wickets of the Sir Learie Constantine's XI, one being Sir Len Hutton. An unusual and perhaps rare item of memorabilia from the tour. Excellent Est. £18/25

8. A small collection of items collected by Bill whilst on holiday in Australia in 2004. Tickets, fixture cards, ground passes including a programme for the ING Cup listing the fixtures. Members may recall that in January 2024 we listed a cap with a spider on it but we had no idea which team it referred to. It transpires that West End Redbacks are the South Australia representatives in the ING Cup. VG Est. £5/8

9. Report of the Tour of Australia and New Zealand by the Women's Cricket Association 1968/69. A 20pp report with the scores of the Test matches with commentary of the tour in general and statistics. Although in this 'Ephemera' section, the cover was **signed** by Sheila Plant at the November meeting at Lord's; she was the wicketkeeper for the first Test v Australia. A recent magazine article was about the award of her England – and Surrey – caps. A rare item Excellent Est. $\pounds 15/20$

10. Four Lancashire League items involving Nelson from the 1950s. (1) Programme with scorecard in centrefold for Rishton v Nelson, ND, Drennan and Wardle the respective pros; (2) Programme with scorecard in centrefold for Burnley v Nelson 1959, Smith and Wardle respective pros; (3) Scorecard for Nelson v Colne 1957, Gupte and Jayasinghe respective pros; and (4) Scorecard for Rawtenstall v Nelson 1957, Jackson and Dooland respective pros. All scores filled in by hand. All VG Est. $\pounds 12/18$

11. Handbook for Mitcham CC, 1939. Small 48pp fixture list etc. in stiff card covers. Interesting four page article by Andrew Sandham entitled "My Cricket Tours". VG Est. £6/10

12. Highfield CC, 2003. Small 28pp fixture list and handbook in stiff card covers. Included is an action photograph by Bill of Eric Woods who died shortly after the season ended. The handbook's opening paragraph shows the esteem in which the club held him. Indeed, in the Roll of Honour his name is in the list for 2^{nd} XI Bowling. He was a friend and colleague of Bill's. Excellent Est. £2/3

13. Somerset scorecard etc. Scorecard for Somerset v Essex 13th May 2006 partially printed. The previous Friday evening was the Somerset Former Players Dinner and included are eight place name cards for the table at which Bill was sat, small cards with a view across the ground to the two churches. Not signed, just named. All excellent Est. £2/3

14. CMS Phonecards 1, 3 and 4. Each mounted on the cards with which they were issued. No. 1 is the Grace card -211/1,000, no. 3 is the Compton card -511/1,000 and no. 4 is the Washbrook card, limited to 1,000 but unnumbered. Sold with a bundle of other phonecards, mainly BT and Warwickshire but the odd ones from Ireland, West Indies and Jersey (Christmas 1998 – not cricket related). All excellent Est. £4/6

15. Sir Arthur Conan Doyle. A First Day Cover issued on 25th August 1995 to remember the occasion when Conan Doyle dismissed W G Grace. The match was London County v MCC held at the Crystal Palace. Included are various relevant articles/Photostat copies including a copy of a poem – A Reminiscence of Cricket – which he wrote about the occasion; and the scorecard. An interesting little collection. VG, cover excellent Est. £5/8

This was Conan Doyle's only wicket in 1^{st} class cricket and he dismissed Grace after he had scored 110 in the 2^{nd} innings. Conan Doyle final figures were 2.1-1-4-1. With the bat he scored 4 and 0.

16. Mainly Bradman but....others too. A file containing three sets of the 'Australian Legends' stamps portraying Don Bradman; a set of the 20 Bradman collection cards; various other press cuttings and cards about Bradman plus newspaper cuttings following Richie Benaud's death, Bill Johnston's obituary, an article by Michael Atherton concerning the inquest into Philip Hughes' death and a Photostat of an article from *Freemasonry Today* about cricketers who were also masons. This is a fascinating collection (which took me longer to read than list). VG/excellent

17. Vanity Fair 1869-1914 "Cricketer Caricatures". A set of 31 cards in display cards of those cricketers whose caricatures were depicted in *Vanity Fair* in cricket attire. A further card is the title card and the last one a fact card indicating that 69 caricatures featured people with a cricket connection, the other 38 were shown in formal attire (although, personally, I wouldn't describe C B Fry's attire as 'formal'!). No publisher nor year of publication shown. Excellent Est. £10/15

18. Player's Cigarette cards. Forty nine of the set of fifty mounted on two stiff cards. The set is from 1930. VG Est. £8/12

19. Three Women's Cricket brochures/programmes. (1) The Golden Jubilee 1926-1976 brochure for the 1976 England v Australia series, including an introduction of the players produced by St Ivel with the Pye TV leaflet; (2) Brochure for the England v India series 1999; and (3) Programme for the England v Australia ODI at Derby 2001. Item (1) is scarce and the inserts far rarer. All excellent Est. £15/25

20. Folder of articles by Steve James. Press cuttings from the *Telegraph* from mainly 2011. A CMS Compliment slip detailing the contents has been **signed** by Steve James. VG Est. £3/5

21. A 'Bill' folder concerning the first day of the 2012 season when Lancashire played Sussex at Aigburth. Many photographs all mounted on card – two per page – each annotated. A lovely presentation. As produced Est. £5/8

22. A 'Bill' folder concerning his first day of the 2013 season, it being the 2nd day of Lancashire v Worcestershire at Old Trafford. Many photographs all mounted on card – two/three per page – each annotated; scorecard included (partially completed by hand). A lovely presentation. As produced Est. £5/8

23. A 'Bill' folder concerning the first home match of the 2017 season, it being Lancashire v Somerset at Old Trafford. Many photographs all mounted on card – two per page – each annotated. Certainly three CMS members among the autograph collectors. A lovely presentation. As produced Est. £5/8

24. Brochure issued for the Diamond Jubilee of West Indian Test Cricket 1928-1988. A well illustrated 80pp brochure with many good articles, edited by Bridgette Lawrence. Sold with the tour brochure *Cricketers from the West Indies – The 1957 Tour* edited by Gordon Ross. VG

25. Programme for Wales XI v England XI held at Newtown CC (Mid Wales) in 1993. It was described by the Newtown CC Chairman as 'this unique event' and so it might have been. The Welsh team included eight Glamorgan players whilst the England XI was quite a strong squad full of Test players. One imagines this to be quite a rare item. Excellent Est. £4/6

26. Programme for the Minor Counties v Australia match held at Jesmond in 1997. A full Australian XI played. VG Est. £5/8

27. Lascelles Hall Cricket Club Centenary 1925. The commemorative brochure produced for the club's centenary – or is it? It is a 24pp booklet with much history of the club and its players, However, bound in or appended is a continuation of the club which goes up to 1944 at which point the club were about to purchase their ground. It's in Huddersfield for the uninitiated. VG Est. $\pounds 8/12$

28. *Kent versus Surrey* **compiled by George Russ.** A small pamphlet of 16pp produced by the ACS which can be purchased on eBay for £15 or from one of our bookselling chums for £4. VG Est. £2/3

29. Rededication after Restoration of the Memorial to Richard Daft (and family), 2007. A 4pp pamphlet/stiff card giving historical details and the Rededication programme. Included is the Order of Service, a flyer appealing for donations, a letter to Bill from one of the instigators and two photographs – before and after. All excellent Est. \pounds 3/5

30. A folder of Wikipedia extracts plus ten 'Team Mates' prints. Those of you who knew Bill will be aware that his preparations for obtaining signatures were thorough. Here is a 'work in progress' in which there are 30-40 printouts from Wikipedia, each with a picture for signature – the cover with a sticker 'For Signing' – a poignant reminder of our immortality! Of the ten Team Mates prints, a few already have signatures. Someone needs to continue his work.....VG

31. A folder of press photographs and others in a similar vein. Around 20 photographs all waiting to be signed. Each photograph is identified with Bill's meticulous sticker system. I noticed one was already signed but whether it's Sangakkara or the Lancashire bloke I can't tell. VG

32. A bundle of twenty three b&w press photographs. Various sizes, all awaiting signatures. Potpourri, Rodney! VG Est. £4/6

33. A bundle of thirty six mainly b&w press photographs. Various sizes, all awaiting signatures. Potpourri, Rodney! VG Est. £8/10

34. Loughborough Lightning 2018. Two sheets of card to which press or programme photographs have been copied and pasted. There are 15 players (missing Linsey Smith) and 3

members of the coaching staff, including Matthew Hoggard and each of the 18 has **signed** below their names. VG Est. £5/8

35. Programme for Copford CC v Old England, 1988. The centrefold has head and shoulders images of 12 players and each has **signed:** David Allen, Tom Cartwright, Robin Hobbs, Arthur Milton, Jim Parks, Ian Thomson, Roy Booth, Basil D'Oliveira, Jeff Jones, Alan Oakman, Doug Slade and P J Watts (Jim). Additionally, in the margins there are also signatures of Dennis Amiss, Derek Underwood, John Snow and one other. Excellent Est. £18/25

36. Yorkley Star CC – Forest of Dean. An article from a local paper about the renovation of the club's 1930 pavilion; a letter from the club secretary addressed to Bill; and an autograph sheet of the 2007 team **signed** by eleven. Excellent Est. $\pounds 2/3$

37. A copy of *The Cricketer* dated 4th August 1956. This copy contains a detailed description of the 4th Test match at Old Trafford (Laker's match – for younger readers) and the front cover has been signed by Richie Benaud and Alan Oakman. Included is a fully printed copy of the scorecard also signed by Benaud and Oakman. VG Est. £20/30

38. A letter signed by Eddie Barlow on South African Sports Office headed paper. The letter is stereotyped, dated 16^{th} May 1985 and is about 'Equal Opportunities through Sport', an organisation of which Eddie Barlow was the Director. The letter is hand signed, as one can feel the indentation through the paper. Punch holes to left side, VG Est. $\pounds6/10$

39. Bob Bond's Cricket Impressions. A sheet with Bob's heading and list of illustrations, with a hand written note to Bill to bottom right. Included are the illustrations, in colour, of Neil Fairbrother, Ted Dexter, Len Hutton, Jim Laker, Denis Compton, Tom Graveney, Alec Bedser, Colin Cowdrey and Cyril Washbrook, the latter being b&w. Those of Fairbrother, Dexter and Graveney have been **signed.** VG Est. £10/15

40. County Captains 2016 card. An A4 card, sponsored by Specsavers to top right. With county emblem and a box in which to sign for the 18 counties. It has been **signed** by 13 of the 18, those missing being Derbyshire, Glamorgan, Kent, Northamptonshire and Sussex. VG

41. Three Lancashire League limited edition 'achievement' cards. (1) Corrie Jordaan 100 wickets in a season (1997) for Lowerhouse 138/150 **signed** by Jordaan; (2) Ben Johnson 1,718 runs (plus 62 wickets) in 1996 for Colne, which beat the highest total in the Lancashire League 34/50 **signed** by Johnson; and (3) Allan Donald who against Haslingden took 7-18 and against Accrington took 7-3, the opposition being dismissed for 31 and 18 respectively. (By sheer coincidence Donald scored 40 and 20.) The card shows both scorecards 38/50 **signed** by Donald. Excellent

42. A collection of CMS's own memorabilia. (1) Richard Johnson 10-45 card, LE 40/101 signed by Johnson; (2) Dominic Cork's hat trick card, LE 62/100 signed by Cork; (3) Jayasuriya and Mahanama' run riot card (340 and 225 respectively), LE 30/50 signed copies (a further 50 were unsigned) signed by both; (4) D N T Zoysa's hat trick card, LE 9/50 (a further 50 were

unsigned) **signed** by Zoysa; (5) an A4 sheet from the Worcester meeting January 1999 **signed** by Tom Graveney, Roy Tattersall and Arthur Milton; (6) an A4 sheet from the Elland CC meeting December 1997 **signed** by Eddie Leadbeater and Ken Taylor; (7) an A4 sheet from the Leicester meeting January 1998 **signed** by Charles Palmer and Les Taylor; (8) an A4 sheet from the Nottingham meeting April 1997 (10th anniversary) **signed** by Dennis Brookes, Les Jackson and Godfrey Evans; (9) an A4 sheet from the Manchester meeting February 1996 **signed** by Peter Lever and Ken Shuttleworth; (10) five auction catalogues 10/96, 2/97, 5/97, 12/97, 10/98 and 10/02; and (11) Directory of Members 1996 and 1999 editions. Mostly VG

Please be aware that your scribe is unclear whether items (4) to (8) are actual signatures or whether copied sheets were made available.

43. S B Hainsworth XI v Yorkshire XI, 1970 for the Brian Close Testimonial. A folding sheet of stiff card **signed** by Binks, Wardle, Vic Wilson, Chester Watson, S Abed, Bore, Batty, McKenzie and Hardy of the Hainsworth XI and Close, Boycott, Hampshire, Bairstow, Don Wilson, Nicholson and Cope of the Yorkshire XI plus Len Hutton, Colin Johnson, Bruce Francis and two others. VG Est. £18/25

44. Programme for The Lord's Taverners v Notts Forest CC. A 36pp programme **signed** by Bill Crozier, Peter Dynely, Jane Hilton, John Alderton and Johnny Wardle. VG Est. £6/10

45. Souvenir Programme for a Lancashire Schools Cricket Association match v Yorkshire held at Egerton Park, Denton on 26th June 1948. The centre fold scorecard has been signed by all the players from both sides. The first page has also been signed by Lancashire 1948 players including Alan Wharton, Alan Wilson and John Ikin (10 in total). Signatures in the centre fold to note are J van Geloven and D E V Padgett of Yorkshire Boys and J Dyson and R Collins of Lancashire Boys. What happened to the others might take some research. As good for its years as me! A very rare item Est. £35/50

46. Two letters. (1) A handwritten letter to Bill from Tony Lewis about our *Cricket Collectors* book which he wanted to buy. Clear handwriting with excellent signature; and **(2)** A typed letter to Bill on Arundel Castle Cricket Foundation notepaper signed by John Barclay – about the book *Team Mates.* Both excellent Est. £6/10

47. Australian Cricket Tour 1989. An official team sheet signed by 17 plus the manager and coach. Not sure is this is genuine or a facsimile, hence the estimate. You may be acquiring a bargain! Excellent Est. £5/8

48. Lancashire autographs 2010. A stiff official card signed by 23 players. Excellent Est. £4/6

49. England v India 1996 Texaco Trophy autograph sheet. An A4 sheet signed by all 12 players, including the sadly departed Graham Thorpe. Excellent Est. £10/12

50. England Tour to New Zealand 1978 autograph sheet. An A4 sheet signed by all 16 players plus the manager (Ken Barrington), physio and scorer. Excellent Est. £18/25

51. Zimbabwe to England Squad 2000 autograph sheet on Zimbabwe Cricket Union headed paper. Signed by all 16 players plus manager, coach, physio, fitness trainer and bowling coach. Excellent Est. £10/15

52. A Lancashire Christmas card signed by Cedric Rhoades, Jack Bond, Frank Hayes, Paul Allott, Clive Lloyd, John Savage, Chris Hassell (the CEO) and two staff members. Ordinary non-cricket related card but good signatures. Excellent Est. £2/3

53. County Cricket Coaches 2004. An A4 still card with a box for each county with the coat of arms and the **signatures** of the 18 coaches. Among them are Tom Moody, John Inverarity, Kepler Wessels and David Houghton. Excellent Est. £5/8

54. 2009 autograph cards. An A4 card headed with a Liverpool Victoria emblem with a box for each county with the coat of arms and the **signatures** of the 9 of the 18 captains. Included are three cards of Bill's homemade kind for coaches, umpires and foreign players. The coaches card is complete except for Glamorgan, Gloucestershire and Leicestershire; the umpires one has around 30 autographs (and there is a sticker on the reverse listing them); and the foreign players card has only 9. Bill's cards are immaculately made and annotated. Excellent Est. $\pounds 18/25$

55. Five 'Bill' autograph cards for 2010. (1) Captains missing Middlesex, Northamptonshire, Sussex and Gloucestershire – but two for Derbyshire; (2) Overseas Players with 15 signatures, with several counties employing more than one; (3) T20 Guest Players with 13 signatures (some interesting names); (4) Wicketkeepers missing Gloucestershire, Middlesex and Sussex, but with two from Yorkshire; and (5) Umpires with nigh on 40 including some overseas umpires. Bill's list indicates that Rob Bailey, George Sharp and J W Lloyds are missing. All excellent

56. Two 'Bill' autograph cards for 2011. (1) Captains missing Durham, Kent, Middlesex and Worcestershire; and (2) Umpires – the usual plethora, but listed on the reverse. Excellent

57. Three 'Bill' autograph cards. (1) Coaches with 24 signatures, including the Scotland coach;
(2) Designated overseas players (this on thin A4 paper) with 14 signatures – some good names here; and (3) Umpires – the usual plethora, but listed on the reverse. Excellent Est. £15/25

58. Two First Class Umpire cards issued, one imagines, by the ECB as their logo is at the top. Of the potential 25 signatures 14 have signed. Excellent Est. £5/8

59. Yorkshire Former Players – 1st April 2012. It's blank – oh no it isn't! **Signed** by 10 including Stott, Bird, Hampshire, Taylor and Appleyard. Excellent Est. £8/12

60. Lancashire Former Players – August 2012. Signed by 15 including Hilton, Pullar, Lee, Ramadhin, Entwistle, Bennett and Clayton. Excellent Est. £10/15

61. Two 'Bill' autograph sheets (thin paper) for 2012. (1) Umpires – the usual plethora, but with a printed list from the ECB website attached; and (2) Wicketkeepers, not just counties but

the odd international plus 2^{nd} XI and others – 23 in total, including Tim Paine. Excellent Est. $\pounds 6/10$

62. Two 'Bill' cards of 2016 Overseas Players. Not as many as could have been collected but 14 in total including Best (Tino, not George), Williamson, Sangakkara and Matt Henry. Excellent Est. £8/12

63. Yorkshire Former Players Reunion 2008. An A4 sheet with 17 signatures including Cope, Don Wilson, Taylor, Bore, Sharpe and Appleyard. Excellent Est. £10/15

64. Official Yorkshire sheet 1997. Produced on glossy paper with the Tetley logo, head and shoulders pictures of 25 players with 24 having signed; the missing signature is that of Kettleborough. Excellent Est. £5/8

65. Somerset Former Players 2009. A 'Bill' card signed by 12 including Virgin, Whitehead, Langford, Fussell, G Atkinson and Popplewell. Excellent Est. £8/12

66. Yorkshire Former Players 2009. A 'Bill' card signed by 19 including Close, Holding, Cooper, Burgin, Binks, Richard Hutton and Metcalfe. **Sold with** a further 2009 reunion card with 19 signatures, most as the first listed card. Both excellent Est. £10/15

67. Lancashire Former Players Reunion 2009. A 'Bill' card signed by 16 including Parr, Collins, Standring, Farrar, Roberts, Pilling and Houlton. Several of these from the 1950s and early 1960s. Excellent Est. £20/30

68. Sri Lankan signatures. Two sheets headed Amaya Lake, Dambulla, a hotel in which Bill and Ann stayed. There was a match at Dambulla between Western South and Central. Who would not expect Bill to obtain the autographs of both teams – a total of around 26 signatures. Whether any of these players progressed to higher levels of cricket is for the buyer to establish. VG Est. $\pounds 3/5$

69. A collection of material relating to the England v West Indies Test match, Headingley, 2000.
