Conditions of Sale

The CMS welcomes items of cricket memorabilia for its auctions. There will normally be just two room auctions in the year - March and October, with a postal auction in July.

The CMS reserves the right to refuse items which are damaged etc., or we have doubts about authenticity.

Reserves can be placed on lots but must be agreed with the CMS. They should reflect realistic values/expectations and not be the "highest price" expected.

The CMS will take 7% of the price realised, the vendor 93% which will normally be paid 6 weeks after the auction in respect of Society members. The rate for non-members is 10%.

The CMS will undertake to advertise the memorabilia to all its members (including overseas) and only CMS members are eligible to bid for items.

Members are welcome to send postal bids which should be in writing/e-mail before the auction. Bids will normally start at 60% of the lower estimate unless there is a higher reserve price or other postal bids. Any bids submitted with pence, ie. £5.20 or £5.80, will automatically be rounded up.

Items will be sent to successful postal bidders after the auction and will usually be sent by recorded delivery. Postage will be paid by the successful postal bidder. However, framed and glazed items must be collected at an auction or arrangements made for collection unless the buyer is content for items to be sent without insurance cover, as the CMS is unable to obtain insurance for such items.

The CMS will be responsible for the items sent for auction while they are in the possession of the CMS.

The CMS welcomes items of particular and unusual interest for the auctions. Non-members can send items for auction but we would discourage large quantities of books, magazines etc.

A list of prices realised at an auction will be displayed on the Society's website after the auction.

Remember - it is the only cricket auction with no buyers premium!

18. Don Bradman. Seven items: (1) *Images of Bradman* edited by Peter Allen and James Kemsley, 1st edition, 1994, dw. Published in Australia by The Bradman Museum, Bowral. A stunning publication of 304pp; (2) *Bradman – The Don Declares* – a set of eight tape cassettes produced in 1988 in a specially designed folder, each tape lasting between 25 and 30 minutes and covering an array of subjects. There is a **laid down signature** of Bradman inside the cover; (3) *Wisden on Bradman* 90th birthday edition, limited 1st edition 1998, dw. Although the dw says it is a limited edition, there is no trace of its limitation details. Edited by Graeme Wright. Some related press cuttings are inserted loosely; (4) an Arnott's biscuit tin (empty) with Bradman illustrations, text etc, produced in Australia and endorsed by the Bradman Museum; (5) *Sir Donald Bradman – Australian Legend* – a booklet produced by Australia Post to commemorate the naming of Bradman as the first Australian Legend and containing the two 45c stamps; (6) the

Service of Thanksgiving, 28 March 2001 at Bowral; and (7) seven copies of *Boundary* – the Journal of the Bradman Museum and three other publications concerning/commemorating Bradman's passing. Some less easier to find items of Bradman memorabilia. All excellent

19. Twelve late 1940s/1950s scorecards for Lancashire/Central Lancashire League fixtures.

The grounds cover Rochdale, Crompton, Radcliffe (Sobers was the pro), Milnrow (one against Radcliffe when Worrell was pro), East Lancashire, Rishton, Middleton (Gilchrist was pro). Given their age and the flimsy nature of each, these are in remarkably good condition. It should go without saying that such items are exceedingly rare to find.

A set of 24 covers **signed** by team members where shown: Argentina (2 – one signed, one blank); Bangladesh (1 signed); Bermuda (1 not signed); Canada (2 – one signed, one blank); Denmark (1 signed); Israel (1 not signed); East Africa (2 – one signed, one blank); Malaysia (2 – one signed, one blank); Netherlands (2 - one signed, one blank); Papua and New Guinea (2 - one signed, one blank); Singapore (2 – one signed, one blank); Sri Lanka (2 – one signed, one blank; and United States (2 – one signed, one blank). Each of the signed covers has a UK stamp and is dated Worcester 21 June 1979. Each of the blank covers has a stamp of that country with a variety of dates. Each one is in an album sheet and is excellent.

21. Scorecard for Somerset v Lancashire at Bath, 1953. This was the match which finished at 5.25pm on the first day. The Somerset 1st innings of 55 is printed; the Lancashire 1st innings of 158 is part printed and part completed in ink; and the Somerset 2nd innings of 79 is fully completed in ink. The bowling figures, result and time of the finish are fully recorded. Roy Tattersall had figures of 7-25 and 6-44. No-one in the Somerset 1st innings reached double figures, with Redman, batting at no. 10, scoring 27 not out in the 2nd innings, before which the score was 44-9. **Sold with** a copy of the Somerset Year Book 1953-54 which contains scorecards of all their 1953 matches. The Report of the 1953 season is unsurprisingly silent about this most unusual occurrence. Both VG

This is accompanied by an A4 sized stiff card on which is mounted a photograph (looks to be part of a newspaper) of three rows of five of the tourists and captain Jack Cheetham to one side, **signed** by all 16. Laid down to the bottom right corner is the **signature** of Ken Viljoen, the Tour Manager. **Sold with** a miniature bat from the 1956 fixture at Ellis Park, Johannesburg, between Natal and Transvaal. This contains the **signatures** of both teams (12 of each), many of which are identifiable, some by reference to the first item. A good collection.

25. Rare programme for England XI v Commonwealth XI played at Gigg Lane, Bury as a floodlit match on 12th and 13th October 1954 and thought to be the first cricket match at Gigg Lane. Both sides included big names of the day with Washbrook captaining the England XI which included Kenyon, Gladwin, Trueman and Close. The Commonwealth XI was captained by Livingston and included Worrell, Pepper, Tribe and Ramadhin. It is highly likely that very few of these remain. Condition is good+

27. *A Bibliography of Cricket* compiled by E W Padwick. 1st edition, 1977, dw. Produced by the Library Association for the Cricket Society, this is the first of the Padwick bibliographies and as there were only 750 copies produced is quite difficult to acquire. Very neatly annotated to the front cover are brief details of the 2nd edition of 1984 and across the bottom edge of the pages a previous owner had crudely written a name, but hardly enough to affect its condition. VG

30. Three teddy bears with county badges. These are Essex and Lancashire with blue bodies and trimmings in yellow and Yorkshire with black body and light blue trimmings. Each is around 16" in height. **Sold with** two further cricketing teddies, slightly smaller, the first is actually a rabbit with a cricket sweater, pads and a bat loosely fastened to a paw; the second really is a bear with a blue cap and a Yorkshire badge, long sleeved sweater, pads and carrying a bat. Only the last one has a maker, that of Merrythought, which those of you who know anything about collectible teddies will recognise. Whilst we can't offer Steiff bears, a good English brand will have to suffice. They are all in good condition but would benefit from a wash.

It is from the "Art of Sport" series made from cold cast porcelain by Paul Szeiler for Endurance Ltd as a limited edition in 1994. The label on the base reads "IAN BOTHAM ENGLAND 1977-1989". The statuette is in very good condition with no easily seen faults.

Hughes has **signed** boldly on the title page together with Mike Gatting his county captain. **Sold with Yakking Around the World by Simon Hughes.** Brilliantly funny account of his travails within the world of cricket. First edition 2000. Very good condition with similar unclipped dust jacket. Hughes has **signed** boldly on the title page. Est. £10/20

38. Clive Lloyd, The Authorised Biography by Trevor McDonald First edition 1985. Very good condition with similar price clipped dust jacket. Lloyd has **signed** boldly on the front end paper Est. £3/5

39. West Indies 1928. Five pencil signatures of team members on a piece of an album page: Tommy Scott, Clifford Roach, James Neblett, Wilton St. Hill and Learie Constantine. Est. £20/40

The West Indies team of 1928 was the first to play Test Cricket. They lost all three Tests by an innings and won only five of the thirty first class matches played. James Neblett did not play in a Test Match on this tour and appeared in only one Test against England at Georgetown in 1935. His is a very rare signature.

40. Punch Cartoons. Eighty three cartoons from various dates between July 17th, 1912 and July 2nd, 1947. Mostly full page and from various artists including Frank Reynolds, Fougasse, George Belcher etc. Est. £40/60

41. W. G. Grace Statuette. Showing Grace standing upright in whites with bat to right hand side, on a naturalistic base. By Peter Mook who has signed the base. Overall height 375mm. Est. £30/40

42. W. G. Grace: One page hand written letter on London County Cricket Club notepaper dated June 12th, 1902, to J. Gilman Esq, Jesus College, Cambridge..... My Dear Gilman, I hope you get your Blue all right. Thanks for sending Hollander along. What are your movements-I suppose we shall see you on Monday. With all good wishes I am Yours Truly W.G. Grace. Creases from folding for envelope which is included although not in the best condition. Est. £175/250

Gilman did indeed get his Blue playing for Cambridge against Oxford in 1902, making 0 in the first innings and 37 not out in the second. Gilman (1879-1976) played 41 first class matches between 1900 and 1904 for London County, Middlesex and Cambridge University. The Wisden of 1977 carried, in addition to Gilman's obituary, an interview he had given a few weeks before he died, on his memories of playing alongside Grace for London County.

43. Denis Compton/Bill Edrich. Black and gilt Waterman's fountain pen inscribed "1949 To Denis with best wishes in your benefit year, Bill" A unique memento of the special partnership between Compton and Edrich. Est. £30/50

44. Six Edwardian Waistcoat Buttons. Set of six brass buttons, 9mm circumference with coloured inserts of cricketers in various poses. Complete with fittings and in original box. The buttons are in very good condition but the box is poor. Est. £70/100

45. Seven Australian Test Player's Autographs. Bold signatures on various shapes and coloured pieces, Dirk Wellham, Mike Whitney, John Dyson, Rodney Hogg, Ray Bright, Kim Hughes and Geoff Lawson. Est. £3/5

46. W.G. Grace Handkerchief issued to celebrate his century of centuries, white linen 56 x 56 cm showing Grace seated with title "Champion Cricketer Of The World". Individual centuries identified in a circular display together with a narrative of his career. Apart from minor discolouration in generally good condition. Est. £20/40

47. Robertson Golly Team. Eleven Plaster figures 7 cms high, all different, issued by Messrs Robertson in the 1950s/60s. Robertson in gold on the base of each figure. Rarely seen. Est. £80/120
