Conditions of Sale

The CMS welcomes items of cricket memorabilia for its auctions. There will normally be just two room auctions in the year - March and October, with a postal auction in July.

The CMS reserves the right to refuse items which are damaged etc., or we have doubts about authenticity.

Reserves can be placed on lots but must be agreed with the CMS. They should reflect realistic values/expectations and not be the "highest price" expected.

The CMS will take 7% of the price realised, the vendor 93% which will normally be paid 6 weeks after the auction. The commission for non-members is 10% of the price realised

The CMS will undertake to advertise the memorabilia to all its members (including overseas) and only CMS members are eligible to bid for items.

Members are welcome to send postal bids which should be in writing/e-mail before the auction. Bids will normally start at 60% of the lower estimate unless there is a higher reserve price or other postal bids. Any bids submitted with pence, ie. £5.20 or £5.80, will automatically be rounded up.

Items will be sent to successful postal bidders after the auction and will usually be sent by tracked postage which will be paid by the successful postal bidder. However, framed and glazed items must be collected at an auction or arrangements made for collection unless the buyer is content for items to be sent without insurance cover, as the CMS is unable to obtain insurance for such items.

The CMS will be responsible for the items sent for auction while they are in the possession of the CMS.

The CMS welcomes items of particular and unusual interest for the auctions. Non-members can send items for auction but we would discourage large quantities of books, magazines etc.

A list of prices realised at an auction will be displayed on the Society's website after the auction.

Remember - it is the only cricket auction with no buyers premium!

25. An original 1895 W G Grace 'Century of Centuries plate. The blue Coalport plate with the centre medallion containing a portrait of Grace. It has a gold scalloped edge decorated with bats and balls inside which are stumps and bats detailing each of the hundred first-class centuries. 23cms in diameter. Some very minor discolouring, otherwise excellent Est. £350/500

These plates were produced in either blue, brown, green or red; some have a picture of Grace, others have his signature. Production of the 1895 plate continued for almost 20 years but those produced in 1895 were edged in gold, whereas later issues still had a scalloped edge but no gold.

26. "Hugman's Cricket Annual 1990. A new cricket annual compiled by Peter Arnold and Peter Wynne-Thomas appeared in 1990 giving comprehensive scorecard records of the English first class season. It was claimed to be the first for 100 years but it seems only one was produced. This is it. A so-called "Team of the Year" was identified and excellent colour photographs were included. The following have been **signed**: Jimmy Cook, Somerset; Graeme Hick, Worcestershire; Jack Russell, Gloucestershire; Angus Fraser, Middlesex and Robin Smith, Hampshire. Peter Wynne-Thomas signed the first page. Est. £2/3

27. A small black book of Autographs almost bursting with signatures. Only five of its 118 pages are blank! More than 90 former cricketers have **signed** (five of them have signed twice), as have 15 former footballers, 1 politician and 1 former TV chat show host. Many of the cricketers have been guests at CMS meetings, but among those who have not are: Ray Illingworth, Ian Botham, Allan Border, David Gower, David Sheppard, John Wright, Geoffrey Boycott, Jeff Thomson, Dennis Lillee, John Reid, Jack Russell and Graeme Pollock. The footballers include Denis Law, Nat Lofthouse and Cristiano Ronaldo! (You may like to guess the names of the politician and chat show host, cricket lovers both.) Index at the back of the book. Some rusting to the shield and banners, so good; **(3)** A desk plaque, a Western Province & Boland Cricket Academy shield, laminated on wooden base. Excellent Est. £12/18

29. Two Desk Plaques, one Sri Lankan, the other Bangladeshi. (1) In its original dark blue "velvet" case, a 7 x 5" plaque on a dark wood base, the Sri Lanka Cricket logo with banners above and below, announcing "Sri Lanka Test & ODI Tour of England 2006" on a gold-coloured Perspex? base. A very attractive item. Excellent; and **(2)** In its original dark green "velvet" box, a 7 x 5" clear Perspex? plaque bearing a silver metal plate, scrolled at the top left and bottom, with the logo of the Bangladesh Cricket Board. Legend below reads "To Commemorate the Tour of

England by Bangladesh A July-August 2008". Clasp on the box starting to rust and some tarnishing beginning to appear on the scrolled metal plate. G/VG Est. £18/25

31. Twelve sheets of Cigarette cards (all Dover Reprints). All unused and as new (except one sheet which has three cards removed). Some duplicates. Various series represented e.g. Capstan Cricketer series 1901; Capstan 1903 series "Australian and English Cricketers"; John Player series "Cricketers caricatures by RIP"; Godfrey Phillips series of "Cricketers"; Wills's series "Cricketers, 1928" **and** the three John Player series "Cricketers" 1930, 1934 and 1938. All excellent. **Sold with** thirteen sheets of Cigarette cards (**all Constable Reprints**). All unused (some duplicate sheets and three sheets have had individual cards removed). Various series represented e.g. Capstan 1903 series "Australian and English Cricketers"; Wills's Cricketer series 1901 and 1928; Churchman's "Men of the Moment in Sport"; J A Patteuoux's "Cricketers Series"; J Millhoff's (De Reske) "Famous Test Cricketers"; John Player series "Cricketers caricatures by RIP"; Godfrey Phillips series of "Cricketers" **and** the two John Player series "Cricketers" 1934 and 1938. Very minor damage to a small number of individual cards, otherwise excellent Est. £5/8

32. Two West Indies cricket cards, both 3.5 x 2.5". A sample card from the 1994 Futera Sports Cards "Great Cricket Memories" series featuring colour images of Clive Lloyd and marked "GCM2" and "SAMPLE of 5000", together with a fixture card for the 1999 Cable & Wireless series between West Indies and Australia, with a colour image on one side of six West Indian cricketers, needless to say Curtly Ambrose head and shoulders above the rest. Slight scratches otherwise VG Est. £4/8

33. Two copies of Rothmans Test Cricket Almanack those covering the 1964 Australia tour and 1966 West Indies tour. Staples rusty, some creasing to cover of 1964 edition, otherwise VG. **Sold with** six copies of *Cricketers from...* two copies each of the tours by West Indies (1950), Australia (1953) and Australia (1961). Condition varies Fair/VG, but one image (of Ian Craig) has been cut from the 1953 version. Est. £5/8

34. Time Table, Marylebone Cricket Club English Team 1903-4. A small (5 x 3.5", folded in half) card bearing the itinerary for Plum Warner's tour to Australia. The reverse lists the three amateurs and eleven professionals (note, no "batting coach" or "mental-skills coach" in those days!). Initialled manuscript annotation to cover states "30 of these posted separately" and the itinerary has some manuscript amendments. A rare survivor. VG Est. £25/35

35. Cricket Hints & Information. A small (5.5 x 4") 28pp booklet, published in 1932 by Allied Newspapers and no.7 in the "New Series" of Boys' Magazine Wonder Books. Includes a photo of "Yorkshire CCC – last year's Champions" and a centrefold with profiles and caricature images of "The World's Ten Leading Cricketers". Some spine damage but overall Good+ Est. £12/18

36. Programme for the 250th anniversary match, Duke of Richmond's XII v The Gentlemen of Pepperharrowe, 1977. A large, (8.75 x 10.5") 12pp programme for the match at The Cricket ground, Goodwood, Sussex to be played "In the dress and under the laws of 1727" with proceeds to the Queen's Silver Jubilee Appeal. Godfrey Evans (who would doubtless have revelled dressed as a 1727 cricketer), Don Smith and George Cox are listed on the unmarked centrefold scorecard for the Duke's team. Some creasing and age spotting, otherwise VG Est. £10/15

37. Six early press photos of Lancashire cricketers. All B&W. (1) 6 x 4" h&s dated 18 June 1938 of Len Wilkinson, who took 151 wickets that season and played three Tests for England in the winter; (2) 8 x 6" h&s dated 11 July 1959 of Alan Wharton; (3) 4.25 x 6.5" dated 24 April

1930 of George Duckworth; **(4)** 3.75 x 5.5" dated 24 April 1934 of George Duckworth; **(5)** 6 x 7.5" h&s undated of Stan Worthington (Derbyshire and England, Lancashire coach in the 1960s); and **(6)** 8 x 10" landscape dated 8 April 1935 of Ernest Tyldesley in batting action v Middlesex at Lord's, pulling a ball from Walter Robins to the boundary. Some of images have printer's markings, condition varies G/VG Est. £6/10

38. Large photo pasted to a board – Players team 1930/32? A large (9.25 x 11.25") team photo of 12 players, which may be the team that met the Gentlemen in 1930 or 1932, but your Auction Team has been unable to fully verify. A research opportunity? Among those identified are: Hobbs (Capt.), Sutcliffe, Hendren, Hearne JW, Duckworth, Tyldesley E, Tate and Woolley. Some damage to the lower edge, but the images of the players are clear and unaffected. VG Est. £8/12

39. Leonardo Collection: Lilley Cricket Club Pavilion Teapot. A very ornate representation of a village club cricket pavilion in the shape of a teapot. Three figures at the front two padded up ready to go and one spectator. In excellent condition but only an ornament and not to be used as a teapot! Approximate size 18 x 18 cms. Est. £8/12

40. Teapot by Swineside Ceramics. "The Teapottery" in the form of a pavilion with three players on the front. The clock acts as the lid. Overall size, length 22cms including spout and handle, height 16cms including lid and width 11cms. In very good, boxed condition. Est. £8/12

- 67. Surrey v Lancashire County Championship May 1990.** A typed completed scorecard **signed** by Ian Greig (291 of Surrey's 707-9) and Neil Fairbrother (366 of Lancashire's 863). Est. £5/8
- 68. MCC v Rest of the World, Lord's August 1987.** Two typed completed scorecards, one **signed** by Mike Gatting 179, the other by Chris Broad 10 & 2. This is the match where Gordon Greenidge, playing for the MCC made 122, becoming the first player to appear on the Honours Board for both the home and visiting sides. Est. £10/12

85. A large 'golly' teapot. Oblong, not round, with the same image of the 'golly' playing a sweep to leg. Manufactured by the Silver Crane Company, it is still available on their website at £89.99. Stands almost 9" tall with an overall width of 8". VG+ Est. £20/30

86. A W G Grace mug with lid. An unusual design as the ‘front’ requires the user to hold it in their left hand. Thus, the front is the face of Grace with thick black beard, the reverse has the old insignia of two stumps with a red ball at the base and a bat to each side, with the date 1750 below. The lid is his red cap with yellow bands and, rather helpfully, a piece with ‘W G Grace’ on it. But for that one might be left wondering who the subject is. It’s probably made of ironstone or some similar hard wearing material, brown apart from the black beard and the lid. Just over 6” tall and 5” wide, as measured with the handle. There is something to the base but research has failed to identify the maker. VG+ Est. £8/12

87. A most unusual Richard Parrington teapot. Indeed this is a design which the Auction Team have not seen before. The lid is a folded cricket sweater with a ball on the top. The spout and handle are to each side. There is no means of hanging it up, nor for displaying it in any other way, but it would not look out of place attached to an external wall or door. No maker details – perhaps a one-off. This engraving appeared in the Sporting Magazine in 1793. The plate has a gold rim and the lettering etc to the front is also in gold. Thus, Marylebone Cricket Club above the illustration and 1797 ... 1987 below. The text as quoted above is on the reverse. 11” in diameter. As new Est. £8/12

92. “An Edwardian Summer” bone china plate by Royal Worcester. The whole of the front is an image of Eton v Harrow at Lord’s. Essentially the scene of gentlemen and ladies in their finery with a few cricketers in the background and part of the pavilion behind. 93. Four saucer shaped items – one a saucer! A useful thing – mine has a fastener and another cricket image. VG. **Sold with** a tin manufactured for Cadbury's with a Regency cricket scene to the lid – 10 5 x 16½" – and equally useful. 111. Three mounted, framed and glazed Johnnie Walker whisky adverts. Using sports to advertise products developed mainly in the inter-war years. These are undated but their ‘striding man’ image was used pre-1939. **(1)** the ‘striding man’ with a cricketer on either side with the caption ‘Thank you Johnnie Walker’, portrait, measuring overall 17 x 12”, advert 12 x 9”; **(2)** the ‘striding man’ with a 19th century cricketer to his right and a 20th century one to his left with the caption ‘Time Marches On!’, size as (1); **(3)** the ‘striding man’ is bottom right, the main image being a pad, ball and three stumps all laid on the ground with the caption ‘The Round whisky in the Square bottle’. 116. A large family of pot etc bear figurines. Fourteen such items ranging from the Regency Fine Arts figure of Henry on a wooden plinth, a couple Nature’s Reserves by Ian Simpson Designs one marked ‘Howzat’ by Me to You to a very small cricket ball which opens to reveal bear-playing cricket scenes. One is slightly less attractive than the others – they just need a good home! All are in excellent condition with no damage Est. £5/8

117. Seven ceramic tankards, pots, jugs. **(1)** the Franklin Porcelain ‘The Ashes Tankard 1882-1982’ with wraparound Victorian cricket scene in brown with W G and the gasholder, to the bottom are two MCC crests and the Ashes urn, 16 cms tall; **(2)** a Sadler tankard entitled ‘Cricket’ with two coloured circular cricket scenes, black and dark green diagonal stripes with very thin yellow and red stripes, 13 cms tall; **(3)** a brown earthenware tankard with a batsman on one side and bowler on the other, 13 cms tall; **(4)** a white jug stamped ‘Fine Derbyshire Pottery’ to the bottom and the Cadbury’s Cocoa advert ‘Not Beaten’ depicting a young boy batting to one side, 13 cms tall; **(5)** a Lancaster and Sandland tankard depicting the Member’s Pavilion, Old Trafford

Some of these are considerably more attractive, whilst some are in far better condition than others. Apart from the minor faults to (1), the others are VG+ and both the hip flask and the spoon are attractive, unusual items worth 30 bob of anyone's money! Est. £5/8

119. A metal doorstop of a cricketer designed to look like W G which fails apart from the MCC cap and the black beard. Thus, an erect batsman with bat and a set of stumps on a matt green base. Stands 25 cms tall and it's heavy – 1.85 kg. Postal bidders should refrain! VG Est. £3/5

120. Three wooden collectibles. (1) a large very solid wooden bear which appears to have been crafted from a single piece of wood. He has a cap and a bat as wide as his left leg, a pad and sweater. His expression is either 'cute' or 'bemused', 24 cms tall; (2) a strange wooden figure of a tall cricketer holding a bat, wearing a cap on a wooded base. His hair and beard are made of a fluffy material and his arms move. He has a tie on a piece of wood that moves up and down. Quite understandably there is no maker's name, 24 cms tall; and (3) a flat wooden cricketer with the words 'old cricketers never die, they just lose their stumps' across his sweater. It's meant to be hung on a wall. Again, no-one owns up to making this either! All are in VG condition, with the bear being most appealing – buy him and chuck the others! Est. £3/5

121. A large, old table cricket game, complete with figures. There are nine fielders and each can be set on a semi-circular metal base. The batsman is permanently fixed but mobile to a degree. There is a bowling chute and to date I've yet to locate the ball – but any small ball bearing will suffice. It measures 40.5 x 30.5", thus rectangular in shape with a series of white lines, also in rectangles delineating how many runs the batsman has scored. Green base (naturally) with a white boundary 'fence'. The field is wooden, the figures, plastic, the bowling chute, metal.
