## Conditions of Sale

The CMS welcomes items of cricket memorabilia for its auctions. There will normally be just two room auctions in the year - March and October, with a postal auction in July.

The CMS reserves the right to refuse items which are damaged etc., or we have doubts about authenticity.

Reserves can be placed on lots but must be agreed with the CMS. They should reflect realistic values/expectations and not be the "highest price" expected.

The CMS will take 7% of the price realised, the vendor 93% which will normally be paid 6 weeks after the auction. The commission for non-members is 10% of the price realised.

The CMS will undertake to advertise the memorabilia to all its members (including overseas) and only CMS members are eligible to bid for items.

Members are welcome to send postal bids which should be in writing/e-mail before the auction. Bids will normally start at 60% of the lower estimate unless there is a higher reserve price or other postal bids. Any bids submitted with pence, ie. £5.20 or £5.80, will automatically be rounded up.

Items will be sent to successful postal bidders after the auction and will usually be sent by tracked postage which will be paid by the successful postal bidder. However, framed and glazed items must be collected at an auction or arrangements made for collection unless the buyer is content for items to be sent without insurance cover, as the CMS is unable to obtain insurance for such items.

The CMS will be responsible for the items sent for auction while they are in the possession of the CMS.

The CMS welcomes items of particular and unusual interest for the auctions. Non-members can send items for auction but we would discourage large quantities of books, magazines etc.

A list of prices realised at an auction will be displayed on the Society's website after the auction.

***Remember - it is the only cricket auction with no buyers premium!***

- 1. Jack O'Connor (1897-1977) England and Essex.** Clear pencil autograph. Described by David Lemmon as Essex's greatest professional batsman between the two world wars. Est. £8/10
- 2. Surrey, County Champions 1952-1956.** Ink signatures of thirteen players who made regular appearances during this period. May, Bedser (A), Bedser (E), Laker, Lock, Constable, Fletcher, McIntyre, Clark, Barrington, Stewart, Pratt and Loader. Est. £12/15
- 3. Ten South African Autographs from 1951 Tour.** Nourse, McLean, Fullerton, Rowan (A), van Ryneveld, McCarthy, Rowan E, Tayfield, Melle (2). Signatures clear and written on two autograph book pages. Est. £8/12
- 4. Jack Hobbs.** A note from Jack Hobbs on the occasion of his last Test Match, written on a page from an autograph album, signed J.B. Hobbs, Kennington Oval, London 22<sup>nd</sup> August 1930 and accompanied by a signed head and shoulders postcard portrait of Hobbs wearing an England blazer. The signature is visible but very faded. **Sold with** a card copy of the scorecard for his benefit match against Kent in August 1919 on the reverse of which is a typed copy of the report on the match in Wisden. The card is signed by Alec and Eric Bedser. Est. £20/25
- 5. Forty Years at the Oval.** MRM '79 TESTIMONIAL, a booklet produced by Surrey to acknowledge the contributions made to the Club by A. J. McIntyre, R. A. Radley and J. F. McQuirke in their capacities as Coach, Cricket Manager, Assistant Secretary for Arthur McIntyre, Printing Manager for Reg Radley and Ground Manager for John McQuirke. All served for at least forty years. The booklet is **signed** by the three beneficiaries and is in very good condition. Est. £12/15
- 6. Multi-Signed Benefit Brochure David Capel 1994.** A good copy of David Capel's brochure signed by team mates of Northamptonshire on the first page. Signatories are Lamb, Cook, Fordham, Penberthy, Taylor, Loye, Felton, Curran, Bailey, Ripley, Ambrose and Capel. Est. £8/12
- 7. Cyril Washbrook Testimonial Fund Brochure 1948.** A brochure in very good condition for its age. Not the glossy tome of modern benefits and not a single advert! Est. £8/12
- 8. Steve Rhodes Benefit Year 1996.** A limited edition print (200/500) of a caricature of Rhodes breaking the wicket signed and numbered by the artist, A. Briggs. In addition, this copy has a signature from a wicketkeeper of every first class county 1996; Blakey, Russell, Stewart, Aymes, Speight, Piper, Krikken, Ripley, Nixon, Brown, Rollins, Hegg, Turner, Moores, Marsh, Batty, Noon, Dawood and Rhodes himself. The print is in very good condition Est. £8/12
- 9. Mushtaq Mohammed Benefit Brochure 1976.** A signed brochure in very good condition. Mushtaq has signed at least seven times, brother Sadiq at least twice, Mike Procter once and Sarfraz Nawaz twice. The articles are excellent including an interesting opening line in David Frith's contribution. Not a common brochure, fifty years old. Est. £10/15
- 10. Colin Milburn.** A signed Testimonial Milburn has signed the cover and inside, which has also been signed by Lillee, Jenner, Hawke and Nadkarni. Est. £8/12
- 11. Dennis Brookes, Testimonial Fund Souvenir.** A four page pamphlet issued in 1947/48 giving a breakdown of his career statistics and a personal resume of highlights in his career. A scarce publication in very good condition. Est. £8/12

**12. Ten Nottinghamshire Autographs.** Ten excellent legible signatures from 1948 on an autograph book page, Sime, Simpson, Keeton, Hardstaff, Harvey, \*Blagg, Poole, Butler, Jepson and Harris Est. £18/22

*Note. The signature is clearly John A Blagg but Helm and Wikipedia refer to an E. Blagg. A single match in 1948 is however consistent.*

**13. Tom Launcelot Taylor (1878-1960).** Excellent autograph by a talented amateur who played under Lord Hawke for Yorkshire. In his brief cricket career, he was chosen by Wisden as a cricketer of the year in 1900 and chosen as 12<sup>th</sup> man for the rain ruined Test at Lord's in 1902. International honours would more than likely have followed. Est. £8/12

**14. Texaco Trophy 1984.** A set of twelve signed cards of players from both teams, England and West Indies. England signatures are Willis, Gower, Botham, Randall, Tavaré and Lamb. West Indies signatures are Lloyd, Richards, Greenidge, Holding, Marshall and Garner. There is a folder specifically designed to hold the cards but they have been kept in plastic sleeves for additional protection so they are all in very good condition with clear legible signatures. Est. £25/30

**15. Eight Yorkshire Signatures** on card. The signatories are Cooper, David Bairstow, Johnson, Sharpe, Nicholson, Woodford, Clifford and Dalton. All good clear signatures but the tense of the heading is no longer valid. Est. £5/8

**16. Joe Hardstaff Benefit Booklet.** A small brochure from 1948 personally dedicated to "Shrimp" (Leveson Gower ??) and signed by Joe Hardstaff. On the back page, available for autographs is a pencil signature of W. Voce. **Sold with** a souvenir booklet for the Benefit Match v Sutton -in - Ashfield. Both booklets are scarce but in very good condition Est. £20/25

**17. C. B. Harris 1949 Benefit Souvenir.** A signed folding card with photographs of Harris's playing colleagues from Nottinghamshire opposite a page of autographs from most. Those who have signed are Sime, Simpson, Voce, Jepson, Butler, Hardstaff, Keeton, Meads, Giles, Woodhead, Poole, Harvey and Harris himself. Over seventy years old and both card and signatures are in very good condition. Est. £15/20

**18. Three Yorkshire Signatures** obtained at a Sports Forum held at St. George's Hall in Bradford. The signatures are: A. Brian Sellers, J. Wardle and W. Watson. There are several more non-cricket autographs, probably Soccer and Rugby League but the cricket ones are clear and well-spaced. The sheet is not dated but just post war is probable. Est. £10/12

**19. Seven Leicestershire Signatures from 1948.** The signatories are Watson, Jackson, Tompkin, Lester, Corral, Berry and Cornock. The autographs are on a page (10 x 12cm) from an album Est. £8/12

**20. Collection of 15 Autographs.** The signatures are on three pieces of paper.
